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S9999	<p>Continued From page 1</p> <p>Based on observation, interview and record review the facility failed to provide cares to a resident in a safe manner which resulted in a resident (R1) sustaining a bruise of unknown origin and being hospitalized for a large contusion/bruise to her leg. This failure applies to 1 of 5 residents (R1) reviewed for safety and supervision in the sample of 5.</p> <p>The findings include:</p> <p>R1's care plan dated January 30, 2023, showed R1 was cognitively impaired related to her diagnosis of dementia. R1 was mostly nonverbal related to her decline in cognitive status. The plan showed R1 was totally dependent on staff for repositioning, transfers, toileting, bathing and eating related to her diagnoses of secondary Parkinsonism, dementia, and progressive supranuclear palsy. R1 was unable to move independently.</p> <p>R1's Skin Worksheet dated March 20, 2023, showed no bruising to R1's entire body.</p> <p>R1's progress note dated March 23, 2023, showed a new bruise was noted to R1's left upper leg area. The bruise measured 10 cm (centimeters) x 6 cm.</p> <p>R1's progress note dated March 24, 2023, showed, "Left upper thigh purplish bruise still remains."</p> <p>R1's progress note dated March 28, 2023, showed R1's bruise to her left hip had worsened, spreading to her left inner groin and vulva. The bruise continued down the front of R1's left thigh and around to the posterior thigh area.</p> <p>R1's progress note dated March 29, 2023, at 8:00 AM, showed R1 was seen by V11 Nurse Practitioner (NP) for the bruising to her left leg. The note showed, "Staff requested evaluation for</p>	S9999		
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S9999	<p>Continued From page 2</p> <p>left hip and groin bruising. Per staff no recent history of fall or trauma. The bruise was discovered last week and was present on the lateral hip. The bruising has now extended to the groin and thigh..." The note showed R1 was nonverbal, unable to answer any of V11's questions related to the cause of her leg bruise. R1's progress note dated March 29, 2023, at 1:55 PM, showed R1 was sent to a local hospital for an evaluation. R1's progress note dated March 29, 2023, at 7:29 PM, showed R1 was admitted to the hospital with a diagnosis of "left leg contusion".</p> <p>On March 30, 2023, at 12:05 PM, V15 Registered Nurse (RN) stated, "I took care of (R1) on 3/21/23 and she had no bruising. By 3/29/23, she had a very large purple-yellow bruise that started at her lateral left hip, went down to her inner left groin/vaginal area, and then around to the back of her left leg. I got no verbal response from (R1) when I asked her what happened. She is totally dependent on staff for cares. She doesn't move at all on her own. This isn't an injury she could have caused on her own. I have no idea what happened to cause this."</p> <p>On March 30, 2023, at 9:53 AM, V7 Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) stated, "I took care of (R1) during the day on 3/22/23. I didn't notice any bruising or redness to her legs or hips. She is nonverbal. She is totally dependent on us for cares. She doesn't move at all. She can't roll in bed on her own. We have to feed her... I don't know what happened to her."</p> <p>On March 30, 2023, at 10:08 AM, V9 CNA stated, "I was getting (R1) ready for bed on 3/23/23 when I first noticed her bruise. I immediately called the nurse. She had a golf ball sized, light bruise to</p>	S9999		

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S9999	<p>Continued From page 3</p> <p>her left inner thigh. It just didn't look right...(R1) is mostly nonverbal. She is total care and can't reposition herself at all. She doesn't have the ability to move herself. We are responsible for moving her and all of her cares...I have no idea how this happened..."</p> <p>On March 30, 2023, at 10:18 AM, V11 Nurse Practitioner stated, "I was initially notified of (R1's) left leg bruise last week. On 3/28/23, the facility called me and asked me to come look at (R1's) bruise because it had gotten a lot worse. I saw (R1) the next day (3/29/23). She had a large bruise from her lateral left hip, down to her left groin, that continued down around to the back of her leg. It was a significant bruise. I asked her what happened but got no verbal response from her. The injury is not something she could have done to herself due to her immobility...She is not on any medication to thin her blood. The lab work and X-rays I had done on her were all normal..."</p> <p>On March 29, 2023, V6 R1's Hospital Physician stated, "(R1) does have a very large bruise from her left inner groin area, up to her left lateral thigh area, that wraps around to her posterior thigh area, to the back of her left knee. Something happened to her to cause that amount of bruising. She does not take any blood thinners. She doesn't move at all on her own..." V6 stated R1's hospital X-rays of her left hip and left leg were normal with no fractures noted. V6 stated R1 was being admitted to the hospital for observation (of left leg bruise).</p> <p>On March 30, 2023, V3 Family of R1 stated, "I do think something happened to cause that significant of a bruise to her left leg. (R1) is mostly nonverbal. She is totally dependent on the</p>	S9999
